Your School Accountability Report Card (SARC) is one of the best sources of information you have about your child's school. It documents how successful your school has been in meeting educational goals; highlights programs and resources for your child; offers important facts about student enrollment, demographics, discipline, class size, facilities, instruction, and teacher qualifications; and provides a helpful overview of your school's unique climate for learning.

SARCs for the current school (2005-2006) will also be available online and at your school beginning February 1, 2006. Please take advantage of this important document to help you evaluate your child's education. ### *Congratulations to AUSD Teacher of the Year Anselmo Reis of Wood Middle School!*

Anselmo Reis, music teacher at Wood Middle School for 13 years, was selected as the 2005-2006 Teacher of the Year for the Alameda Unified School District.
