- 1. Providing state-of-the-art computers and related technologies to students and teachers for multidiscipline and cross-curricular integration.
- 2. Develop student outcomes in all curricular areas that reflect technology as an <u>integrated</u> part of the learning process.
- 3. Promote and support staff development activities that are technologically challenging and curricular based.
- 4. Develop and adopt <u>standards</u> for hardware, software, and technology staff development.

- 5. Install and maintain a state-of-the-art <u>network</u> and associated infrastructure that will connect each site <u>and</u> provide access to the Internet and the rest of the connected world.
- 6. Coordinate <u>all</u> technology activities into one and provide a three year plan and associated budget forecasts.
- 7. <u>Fund and sustain</u> the necessary infrastructure, equipment and staff development to make this plan successful.

As a general rule the educational environments resists change, especially technology. We need textbooks and chalk boards, #2 pencils and wooden rulers. But all successful organizations understand and embrace change. They evolve, adapt and create new processes and procedures to encompase those changes.
