General Information 392 members responded

- 36.5% have taught ONLY in AUSD
- ~10% have been in AUSD 1-2 years
- ~40% have been in AUSD 3~10 years
- ~40% have been in AUSD 11-25 years
- ~10% have been in AUSD > 25 years

Ideal Classroom

Preferred Class Size:

- Over 90% agree small class size is integral to student success
- The majority of members indicated that the optimum class size is between 15 ~ 20
- This preference appears to be fairly consistent no matter what grade level

Value-Added Services

Hours of Service Beyond the 'Duty Day'

- WEEKLY estimated contribution: 6198 ~ 7566 HOURS
- Dollar value calculated at the Teacher Hourly Rate of Pay is between \$190,589 and \$232,655 and at the average teacher pay is between \$440,058 and \$537,186 PER WEEK
- The weekly contribution of hours is equivalent to Between 5.2 and 6.3 FTE teachers working the full year
- Dollar value for the entire school year at the estimated Average cost of a 1.0 FTE teacher is between \$17,086,378 and \$20,857,622

Value-Added Services

Hours of Service Beyond the 'Duty Day'

- Approximately 30% indicated they work at least some part of EVERY weekend during the entire school year
- Approximately 56% 89% indicated they work at least
 ½ of every weekend
- 70% work over winter and spring break
- 80% spend between 1 4 weeks of their summer break preparing for the upcoming school year

Alternative Programs

- 36% have an interest in a Charter School option
- 48% have an interest in a Magnet School option
 But ...
- 80% want alternative programs (Such as Charters and/or Magnets) considered ONLY IF implementing such an option would NOT hurt the District financially

Alternative Programs

Top 3 Magnet/Charter Preferences:

- Performing Arts Focus (43.2%)
- Math / Science Focus (42.1%)



Science / Technology Focus (41.7%)

In Terms of Balancing Enrollment:

- 45.6% favored Magnet Schools to balance enrollment
- 32.2% favored Charter Schools to balance enrollment

School Sites: Should the Master Plan consider consolidating schools?

- 31.9% indicated their preference that NO schools be considered for consolidation
- 18.3% indicated that consolidation should be considered at the elementary level
- 17.7% indicated that consolidation should be considered at the middle school level

School Sites

On-Site Day Care:

72.7% believe that on-site day care should be available for parents at EVERY elementary school

Community Use of Common Areas:

79.6% responded favorably to considering using common areas (such as multi-purpose rooms) for extended-hours, community-centered events like 'movie nights' or other similar events

School District: Balancing Enrollment

- 52.7% think redrawing boundary lines should be considered in the Master Plan process
- 49.4% indicated programmatic changes (such as Magnet School Options) would help balance enrollment across the island
- 42% indicated the AUSD Schools should be open to other Bay Area residents



Student Success: Programmatic Options

- 44.9% want to see 'Grade Level Looping' considered as part of the New Master Plan
- 48.7% indicated an interest in teaching looped classes
- 39% would like the option of 'blocking' English and history at the high school level

Student Success: Programmatic Options

- 69.7% want to see teaching in families or teams of students considered as part of the New Master Plan
- 68.5% indicated that bringing 'advisory' period back at the secondary level would have value for students
- 90.7% indicated that internships for upperlevel high school students should be explored

Student Success:

Valuable Instructional Practices

- 72.7% want to see increased academic freedom to be able to personalize/choose the delivery of curriculum
- 90.1% found value in voluntary release time from their duties to be able to observe their colleagues teach
- 94.9% found value in discussing 'shared students' with their colleagues
- 95.2% found value in sharing 'best practices' with their colleagues

Student Success: Valuable Instructional Practices

- 92.7% value having paid time to collaborate with their colleagues
- 54.8% found 'Lesson Study' to be a valuable practice [21.1% had no experience with Lesson Study]
- 50.8% found value in District-directed Professional Development
- 80.4% found value in other Professional Development

Student Success:

Incentives & Parent Involvement

- 80.1% indicated agreement with offering incentives to both parents and students for student attendance
- 58.9% showed interest in the idea of AUSD offering students incentives for making progress on standardized tests from one year to the next
- 79.8% feel offering 'Parent University Nights' is a valuable tool for parents to support their child's learning
